To the Faire Citizens of Fontaine dans Sable:

Greetings,

Today we will look at a little of the history of heraldry. Often, when we hear the word "herald" we think of someone, like a town crier or a Court herald, summoning someone into the Presence.

Actually from the very early days heralds were charged with tracking the symbols and markings of the nobles and their retainers that they led into battle. Because of their intimate knowledge of the history of the arms and the genealogy of the bearers of those arms they also became the voice of the crown or coronet on the field and in the court. It wasn't until about the 11th century that laws began to come into force regulating the usage and design of arms. A few hundred years later, around the beginning of the 15th century (although some efforts were made at earlier times), at semi-regular intervals the crown would send its heralds out to take rolls of the armory in use at the time along with marriage, birth and death dates.

Perhaps some definitions relating to armory would be helpful. These are official definitions in the SCA and do not necessarily apply to the armory of the Middle Ages, but they may.

Armory: Any design that the College of Arms registers or protects, including devices/arms and badges. This includes various important non-SCA armory from the real world and may also include trademarks, logos, and other graphic symbols that resemble heraldic bearings. *See* the Administrative Handbook, Parts II and III, for a discussion of Registerable and Protected Items.

Armorial: (1) Adjective. Of or related to armory. (2) Noun. A list of armory organized by the bearers' names. *See also* Ordinary.

Arms: In the SCA, people who have been awarded arms by the Crown of a kingdom may call their heraldic device "arms." The distinction between arms and a device is not tracked by the College of Arms. *See also* Armiger, Device.

Device: An heraldic design that uniquely represents the person or group that owns it. A person who has not been awarded arms may register personal armory as a device. This device will become arms when the person receives an award, grant, or patent of arms. The distinction between arms and a device is not tracked by the College of Arms. *See also* Armiger, Arms.

Badge: A piece of armory used by an individual or group to identify possessions, retainers, members, or other items. A badge is different from a device, which is used solely by its owner (or the owner's herald). *See also* Fieldless Armory.

Armiger: A person who has been awarded the right to arms. Arms in the Society can only be given by the Crown of a kingdom, and come in three levels: Awards of Arms, Grants of Arms, and Patents of Arms (or Letters Patent). A person with registered personal armory who is not an armiger has a device, but only armigers have arms.

Blazon: The verbal or written description of a piece of armory. *Example: Sable a saltire Argent and a chief Argent (shown below) or the flag of Scotland (not the Royal flag): Azure a saltire Argent.*

Emblazon: The drawing or graphic depiction of a piece of armory.



In the SCA we do not have Coats of Arms. Coats of Arms include mottos and crests Also, arms are not hereditary in the SCA.

The purpose of arms were to differentiate quickly on the field, at a distance, between friend and foe. For this reason, no matter who you are, the simpler and more easily recognizable your device/arms the better. This should be a standard to strive for as you work to design your armory.

The Rapier's Cut: Famous Duelist Series
Doña Catalina De Erauso (1580-1650)

Of all the famous duelist throughout history, perhaps the most controversial is Catalina De Erauso, or, as she is often called, “the Lieutenant Nun”. At the tender age of fifteen, Catalina cross-dressed her way out of a Spanish convent and sought her fortune in the New World, where she joined the Spanish army, achieving the rank of Lieutenant (serving in the War of Arauco in Chili). During and after her military experience, she killed many men in her life including soldiers, bureaucrats, and even officers of the Spanish crown. In addition to these activities she actively engaged in gambling, practiced swordplay, and was in more than her fair share of brawls. Several times in the course of her life, Catalina broke off marriage proposals to young ladies (the brides-to-be believing her to be a man). Because she amassed quite a criminal background, Catalina often stayed in Cathedrals for sanctuary, which in those days meant that the soldiers could not pursue her there.

Several of Catarina’s most famous duels are described below:

In one fight, she cut a man (Senor Reyes, who had insulted her) across the face with a dagger. Senor Reyes’s friend then came at her with his sword drawn. She drew her own and “thrust (her) blade through his left side and down he went”. A couple of months later Senor Reyes sought revenge with two friends. Catalina received word that three armed men were awaiting her outside. Francisco Zerain (who she had sent for) came into the shop and told her that it was Reyes and two friends. As soon as Francisco and Catalina walked outside, the men attacked and a 2-on-3 melee began. Catalina dispatched one of the men before the sherrif, Don Ordon, and his two deputies arrived and took all the survivors into custody (except for Francisco who managed to escape).

Many of Catalina’s swordfights were the result of her card playing. A merchant once sought revenge on her for a comment that she had made while playing cards. She was walking down a street after the game and turned a corner only to meet up with said merchant. He drew his sword and came at her. She pulled her sword and killed him, but the police arrived on the scene and tried to arrest her. She fought them; taking two wounds in the process, but retreated to the safety of the cathedral.

Another card-game-related duel almost spelled her end. A man that people called “The Cid” joined a friendly card game. Catalina won the hand, but “The Cid” stuck his hand into his winnings and pocketed some of the gold. She let this slide as he did this yet again, but the third time she pinned his hand to the table with her dagger. She immediately jumped to her feet and drew her sword, but the Cid’s partners drew steel as well. They had her so pinned that she took three hits and then stumbled out into the street in what she calls in her autobiography a “bit of luck”. In the street, “The Cid” came after her. She swiped at him, but he was wearing armor and the blow bounced off harmlessly. Two Basqueros joined her in the fight, but it was three on five at that point and Catalina’s side took the worst of it. One of the Cid’s men stabbed her in her left side with his sword and “the Cid” managed to stab his dagger into her shoulder from behind, the blade going clean through it. She reportedly fell to the ground in a pull of her own blood. All fighters fled the scene except for “the Cid” who lingered in a church door. Catalina managed to rise to her feet. “You dog, you are still alive?” “The Cid” called to her. He thrust at her with his blade. She parried the blow to the side with her dagger and stabbed

into a hole in his armor and killed him. She collapsed immediately after. The fighting had drawn a flock of people. The sheriff, don Pedro arrived on the scene.

Although severely wounded in this last duel, it did not kill her (although she was bedridden for over four months). She went on to write her autobiography and eventually died in Cuetzlaxla, New Spain in 1650.
